Rationale and Objectives:	
<p>At Coomb Briggs Primary School we ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils. We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed. In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged. We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged. Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis, which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. As well as improving academic achievement, we want to ensure that our pupils also have access to any pastoral support they may need so that they may look forward to their time at our school with enthusiasm and positivity.</p>	
How it may be spent:	
•	Academic achievement, including providing small group work or 1:1 opportunities with a teaching assistant.
•	Additional teaching and learning opportunities, including those provided through external agencies such as Fortis
•	Monitoring of attainment, progress and behaviour, including behaviour for learning.
•	Financial subsidies for school trips and activities including a residential week in Year 6 and any sporting or cultural activities.
Implementation:	
•	We will provide high quality teaching for all children, regardless of need or age.
•	We will provide targeted pastoral support and academic intervention which is regularly monitored and reviewed
•	We will ensure an exciting curriculum is delivered which inspires and engages our learners to increase their knowledge of the world they live in.
•	We will provide a wide range of extra-curricular activities for all children to participate in which will be subsidised when necessary.
